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





1	Charging contacts
2	Indicator light : Backlighting is red, green, or orange.
3	 Display screen : the current time, number of messages on answering machine or voice mail.

Case 1:

- the display colour selected is "Variable on events",
- time display is activated,
- the handset is placed on its charger.

Case 2:

- the display colour selected is "Red" or "Green" or Orange",
- time display is activated.

If the handset is on or off its charger, the backlighting is set to the selected colour and the current time is displayed.

Note Once the permanent colour has been selected, no other effect is displayed and the charger behaves as a lamp.


Case 3 :

- the display colour selected is "Off",
- time display is activated.

If the handset is on or off its charger, the backlighting is deactivated and the current time is displayed.

Note If time display is deactivated, neither the time nor the indication for answering machine nor for voice mail are displayed.

Installing the phone



- 1 Plug the phone cable into the socket of your base.
- 2 Connect the other end of the cable with the phone wall socket or with the Gateway.
- 3 Connect the power adapter cord to the socket on the bottom of the base.




- 4 Connect the other end of the cable with the power wall socket.
- 5 The indicator on the base lights during 5 seconds.
- 6 Connect the power supply unit to the charger.
- **7** Plug in the other end of the power supply unit to the mains.
- 8 Remove the tab.
- 9 The handset screen comes on. The message "SAGEMCOM" appears on the screen.

Note To ensure optimum charging, leave the handset on the base for at least 10 hours before using the phone for the first time.

Note	If your handset battery is empty leave the handset in the charging unit for
	at least 4 minutes.

Replacing the batteries



- 1 Remove the battery compartment cover.
- 2 Insert the new batteries one by one in compliance with the polarity of the batteries.
- 3 Replace the battery compartment cover.
- 4 Press the cover gently. The "Click" sound indicates that the cover is in the locked position.
- 5 Place the handset on its charger.



The **"Power off ?"** message is displayed on the screen. Press **Yes** $\begin{bmatrix} \bullet \\ \bullet \\ \bullet \\ \bullet \end{bmatrix}$ to confirm.

2 To turn on your handset, press the red key. The "SAGEMCOM" message is displayed on the screen.

Settings to make before use

- When starting up the first time, the Language menu is displayed.
- Select the language to be used using the \checkmark or \checkmark keys and validate using the $\left| \frac{\bullet}{\circ \kappa} \right|$ key.
- The Country menu is displayed.
- The date and time setting menu is displayed.
- Enter the right date and time and validate using the key.
 The message "OK" is displayed on the screen.

Important After setting date and time, place the handset on the charger to synchronise the display.

Making a call


METHOD 1 (PRE-DIALING)



- 1 Pick up the handset.
- 2 Dial your contact's number.
- **3** Press the green key.




METHOD 2 (POST-DIALING)



- 1 Pick up the handset.
- 2 Press the green key.
- 3 Dial your contact's number.

Ending a call



- 1 At the end of the call, press the red key.
- 2 Put the handset back on its charger.


Receiving a call

IF THE «AUTO PICKUP» IS ACTIVATED



Pick up the handset.





Choose your line

This menu allows you to select the line on which you want to make a second outgoing call (subject to availability of service).

- 1 During a call, press **Options**.
- 2 Select Select call line and press Select.
- 3 Select your line using the keys \blacktriangle or \checkmark .
- 4 Press Select. The action is confirmed by the "OK" indication.

Call...

Managing several calls

Your phone allows you to manage several calls (subject to availability of service) when you are already in a call.

Receiving a second call

During a call, a beep indicates the arrival of a second call. The contact details of the second caller are displayed on the screen.

Case 1 : Answer the new call and put the current call on hold.

• Press the green key.

The first caller is put on hold and you can speak with the new caller.

Case 2 : Answer the new call and end the current call.

Press Replace.
 The call with your first caller is ended. You can speak with the new caller.

Note To reject a second call, press **Release all**.

Switching from one call to the other

During a conversation press **Switch**. The current call is put on hold in order to take the call that was previously on hold.



Ending one of the calls in progress

Options > End active call

During a conversation :

- Press **Options**.
- Choose the option End active call using the ▲ or keys.
- Press Select.
 The current call is ended and you resume the previous call.

- OR -

• Press the red key to end the current call.

Note During the call you can hang up both calls by pressing the red key for a long time.

Talking with two contacts at the same time (3-way conference)

Options > 3-part conference

During a double call :

- Press Options.
- Choose the option **3-part conference** using the **•** or **•** keys.
- Press Select.
- You can then talk with the 2 contacts at the same time and "**3-part conference**" is displayed on the screen.
- To end the conference call, press the key.

Making a second call

Options > Second call

During a conversation :


- Press Options.
- Choose the option Second call using the ▲ or keys.
- Dial the number using the keypad and press Call..
- OR -
- Select the number for the person you want to call in the phonebook by pressing , and then press .

The second called number appears on the screen.

A: the number and/or name of the current call.

B : the number and/or the name of the waiting call.

C: the call time.





Transferring calls

During a call, you can transfer it to another handset. This function can be used as long as two handsets have been registered to the same base.

Options > Intercom

UNANNOUNCED TRANSFER

This function allows you to transfer the current call directly to another device.

Steps	Calling handset	Called handset
1	Press Options.	
2	Choose the option Intercom.	
3	Press Select.	
4	Select the handset (or all handsets) to call.	
5	Press Call.	
6		Rings: internal call.
7	Press Trans	
8	Hangs up automatically.	Rings: external call. Take the call.

Note	At the 5 th step you can cancel the transfer of the call.	
	To do this, select Cancel and then validate.

ANNOUNCED TRANSFER

This function allows you to transfer the current call to another device once it has been picked up.

Steps	Calling handset	Called handset
1	Press Options.	
2	Choose the option Intercom.	
3	Press Select.	
4	Select the handset (or all handsets) to call.	
5	Press Call.	
6		Rings : internal call.
7		Press the key to accept the internal call.
8	The external call is put on hold.	
9	Press Trans.	
10	Hangs up automatically. The external call is transferred.	Communicating with the external caller.

Dual incoming call management can also be done via the option **Press R** : **Options > Press R**

- Accepting a second incoming call (unknown call) : Press R.
- Making a second call during communication : **Press R** + recipient number.

• Switching from one call to the other : Press R + [2:].

- Ending a call and switching to the call on hold : **Press R +** (**1**^a).
- Setting up a 3 way-call : Press R + 3.



Options during a call

You can use the following options during a call :

Activate/Deactivate loudspeaker (hands-free mode)



During the call you can activate the hands-free mode by pressing the (\mathbf{q}) key.

The icon 📹 is displayed on the screen.

To deactivate the hands-free mode, press the \triangleleft key again.

The icon disappears.

Note When your battery charging icon displays the minimum, the hands-free mode is unavailable until the next charging cycle. The hands-free mode is optimized for speaking at 50 cm from the handset.

SIXTY 2 Call...

Adjusting volume



During a call you can increase or decrease the volume of the handset by pressing the \checkmark or \checkmark keys on the browser.

A bar graph makes it possible to adjust the volume according to 5 levels.



Activating the mute mode

During a call, you can switch to mute mode and your handset's microphone will be muted and your contact will no longer hear you.

TO ACTIVATE THE MUTE MODE :

• During a conversation, press Mute.

The icon $\underbrace{\mathbf{W}}$ is displayed at the top of the screen.



TO DEACTIVATE THE MUTE MODE :

• Press **Unmute**. Your contact will hear you again.

KEYBOARD SHORTCUT:

During a conversation, press and hold the *#* key to activate/deactivate the mute mode.

SIXTY 2 Call...

Using additional handsets

You can associate additional handsets with your phone. You can then make and receive outside calls or calls between these handsets.

Note You first have to pair the handsets with the base. For further details, refer to the section "**Associating a new handset**", page 51.

Calling another handset (intercom)



- 1 Press INTERN.
- 2 Select the handset (or all handsets) you want to call using the ▲ or keys.
- 3 Press Call. The selected handset rings.



Intrusion

This function allows another paired handset to join a call in progress on another handset.

- You have a call in progress.
- Press and hold the green key from another paired handset.

The handset displays "Local conference" and there is an externally initiated 3 way conference set-up.

Note To activate/deactivate the intrusion, refer to section "Allow three-way communication (Intrusion)", page 62.

Tracking your calls...

Call logs

Logs are lists of numbers or events received or sent by your phone. Depending on your phone provider and the options of your contract, the following information may be accessed in the call logs:

- the date and time of the call.
- the contact's name and/or number.

Note The numbers stored in the call log are prefixed by a symbol :

😤 : List of incoming calls,

😵 : List of outgoing calls,

 \mathbf{X} : List of missed calls.

Displaying the list of all calls

- Press Select.
- Select All calls, then press Select.
- The last call is displayed with its date and time, its status (incoming, outgoing, missed), name and/or number.
- Scroll through the numbers stored in the list using the ▲ or keys.
- Select the call you wish to view and press Details.
- The following information is displayed :
 - the call status (incoming/outgoing/missed),
 - the contact's name,
 - the contact's number,
 - the call date,
 - the call time.
- Press **Back** to return to the previous menu.

Viewing the received or dialed call log

Note Unknown calls are included in the received call log.

- Press Select.
- Select Incoming calls, (or Outgoings calls) then press Select.
- The last received call (or dialed number) is then displayed first.
- The other calls are displayed using the keys \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown .
- Select the call you wish to view and press Details.
- The following information is displayed :
 - the call status (incoming/outgoing/missed),
 - the contact's name,
 - the contact's number,
 - the call date,
 - the call time.

Consulting the missed call log

The **X** icon is displayed if there are one or more new missed calls which have not been reviewed yet.

Note Once the missed call log has been viewed, the icon disappears from all handsets.

- Press Select.
- Select Missed calls, then press Select.
- The latest missed call is displayed.
- Scroll through the numbers stored in the list using the ▲ or keys.
- Select the call you wish to view and press on **Details**.
- The following information is displayed :
 - the call status (received/sent/missed),
 - the contact's name,
 - the contact's number,
 - the call date,
 - the call time.
- Press Back to return to the previous menu.

The events log

Note

The *icon* is displayed if there is one or more voice mail messages.

Checking new events

A summary screen for the number of events that occurred in your absence is displayed :



- the operator messages,
- the number of missed calls.

- Press Select.
- Select Events then press Select.

Managing incoming or outgoing calls

- Press Select.
- Select All calls or Outgoings calls or Incoming calls or Missed calls then press Select.
- The list of calls (incoming/outgoing/missed) is displayed.
- Select the desired call and press Details.
- Press Options for the actions you can perform :
 - Call : call the displayed number,
 - Delete : delete the stored number,
 - Store : save the number in your phonebook,
 - Delete all : delete all the numbers in the list.

Manage your contacts...

Use the phonebook

You can save up to 250 entries (24 digits and 16 characters) in the phonebook. You can also directly access the list of phonebook entries using the regime key.

When browsing through the phonebook, the handset displays in the right top corner the number of the current entry and the total number of available entries.

Create an entry

Menu > Phonebook

- Press Select.
- Select Add and press Select.
- Specify the required information by confirming at each step. To move between the input fields, use ▲ and keys.
- Last name : enter your contact's name,
- First name : enter your contact's first name,
- **Number** : enter the phone number(s) in the corresponding box (Home, Mobile and Work).
- Select from one of the 6 available ring tones using the $\begin{bmatrix} \bullet \\ \bullet \\ \bullet \end{bmatrix}$ or $\begin{bmatrix} \bullet \\ \bullet \\ \bullet \end{bmatrix}$ keys to uniquely identify this contact.

Note To enter a letter, press and hold the required key until the letter is displayed on the screen or press the related key quickly unitl the character required is shown.

Call a contact from the phonebook

Menu > Phonebook

- Press Select.
- Select List or Search and press Select.
- Select an entry and press **Options**.
- Select Call and press Select.

Changing an entry

Menu > Phonebook

- Press Select.
- Select List or Search and press Select.
- Select an entry and press **Options**.
- Select Edit and press Select.
- Change the last name, first name and/or phone number by deleting characters

using the $\sqrt{\frac{1}{c}}$ key and/or the ring tone.

Deleting an entry

Menu > Phonebook

- Press Select.
- Select List or Search and press Select.
- Select an entry and press **Options**.
- · Select Delete and press Select.
- For the question **Delete** ?, press **Yes** $\begin{bmatrix} \bullet \\ \bullet \\ \bullet \\ \bullet \end{bmatrix}$ to confirm the deletion of the entry.

Search for an entry

Menu > Phonebook

- Press Select.
- Select Search and press Select.
- To look up a **Last name**, enter the first letter of the name, the entire name, or part of the name and press **Select**.
- Once the list is displayed, you can also directly enter the first few letters of the name sought.

Delete all the entries

Menu > Phonebook

- Press Select.
- Select Delete all and press Select.
- For the question **Delete all ?**, press **Yes (** to confirm the deletion of all entries.

Speed dialing

This function allows you to assign a keyboard shortcut to a contact in your phonebook.

Note To call your contact, press and hold the key assigned to the number and the number is automatically dialed.

Menu > Phonebook

- Press Select.
- Select Speed dialing and press Select.
- Press Edit.
- Select Edit and press Select.
- Press **Phonebook**, select the contact you want to assign a keypad shortcut. Press **Select**.
- You can also directly enter the number of your choice.
- Once the number is entered, press **Select**. To exit the menu, press **Back** 3 times in succession.

Answering machine...

Note When your answering machine's memory is full, the answering machine turns off. You have to read your messages and delete some to free up memory space.
 The recording capacity of your handset is 40 minutes. The maximum duration of each message is 2 minutes.

Activating/Deactivating the answering machine

When the answering machine is activated, the 🛄 icon is displayed.

Menu > Ans. machine

- Press Select.
- Select On/Off using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.

Answering machine announcements

Note If you have not saved a personal announcement, the answering machine will automatically use the pre-recorded announcement in the specific language of your country.

Choosing your default announcement

Menu > Ans. machine

- Press Select.
- Select Outgoing msg. using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select the language to be used with the keys ▲ or keys and press Select.

Recording your personal announcement

Menu > Ans. machine

- Press Select.
- Select Outgoing msg. using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select Personal using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select Record using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- · Clearly state your announcement.
- Press **Stop**, to stop the recording of the announcement.
- The message **Save changes ?** is displayed, press **Yes** key. The recorded announcement is played.

If you make a mistake while recording the message, repeat the operations described above until you are satisfied with your message.

Note The recording of a new message will automatically replace the previous message.

Listening to your personal announcement

Menu > Ans. machine

- Press Select.
- Select Outgoing msg. using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select Personal using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select Play using the A or Very keys and press Select. The currently used announcement is played. When the personal announcement has finished, your answering machine returns to the previous menu.

Erasing your personal announcement

Menu > Ans. machine

- Press Select.
- Select Outgoing msg. using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select Personal using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.

Note If you have erased your personal message, the answering machine will use the pre-recorded message.

Note You can also listen to the default announcement in the desired language from those available.

Messages


Listening to your messages

If you have received new messages, the icon **••** lights up in green and the message "**New messages : X**" scrolls on the screen.

X : the number of messages on the answering machine

Menu > Ans. machine

- Press Select.
- Select Incoming msg. using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.



A : your correspondent 's name or number.

- **B** : date time of recording of the message.
- C : control keys while reading messages.

The messages are read in chronological order (from oldest to newest).

At the end of the last message, the answering machine will stop automatically.

Note You can also listen to your old messages by selecting "Old" instead of "New".

Managing your messages

When playing back messages, press the following buttons :

Deleting all old messages

Menu > Ans. machine

- Press Select.
- Select Incoming msg. using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- The message "**Delete** ?" is displayed, press **Yes** to confirm the deletion of all old messages.

Querying your answering machine remotely

This function allows you to check your voice messages and change your answering machine settings even when you are not at home.

To remotely access your answering machine :

- Dial your phone number.
- Wait for the answering machine to come on.
- While listening to your announcement press the ***** key and enter your remote access code.

Note	By default, the remote enquiry code is 0000. This code must be	
	modified so that remote access is activated. To modify the	
	remote enquiry code refer to paragraph "Modify the remote	
	enquiry code", page 66.	

- A beep will indicate access to the answering machine, any unread messages will be automatically played back.
- At the end of playback, a new beep will sound to let you know that the answer machine is ready.

You can perform the following operations :

Audio adjustment...

Changing the ringtone

You can change the ring of :

- outside calls,
- calls between handsets (intercom).

Menu > Audio

- Press Select.
- Select External ringtone to change the ringing tone for external calls.
- OR -
- Select Internal ringtone to change the ringing tone for internal calls.
- Scroll through the pre-recorded ringing tones and press Select.

Activating/Deactivating the silent mode

In silent mode, the telephone ringer and keypad beeps are muted.

Note	The # key can also be used to activate/deactivate the silent mode.
	If the silent mode is active the 👗 icon is displayed.

Menu > Audio

- Press Select.
- Select Silent to change the silent mode, then press Select.
- The message " **Disable silent mode ?** " or "**Activate silent mode ?** " is displayed on the screen.
 - Press Yes $\left| \begin{array}{c} \bullet \\ \bullet \\ \bullet \end{array} \right|$ to confirm the question.
 - Press No $\sqrt{\frac{1}{2}}$ to reject the question.

Activating/Deactivating audio alerts

Audio alerts refer to :

- pressing the keypad keys,
- putting the handset on the charger,
- · low battery alert,
- others (error alerts).

Note The activated function is marked by the symbol M.

Menu > Audio

- Press Select.
- Select **Beeps** to change the audio alerts, then press **Select**.
- Select Keypad and press the On/Off key to activate or deactivate the keypad beeps.

- OR -

• Select Charger and press the On/Off key to activate or deactivate the beep when the handset is placed on the charger.

- OR -

- Select Battery low and press the On/Off key to activate or deactivate the low battery warning.
- OR -
- Select Others and press the On/Off key to activate or deactivate the error alerts.

The action is confirmed by the "OK" indication.

Menu > Settings

- Press Select.
- Select Date/Time using the ▲ or vd> keys and press Select.
- The date and time setting screen is displayed, press Edit.
- Set the clock mode (automatic or manual) with On/Off key.
- Press the key and then enter the date in MM/DD/YY format.
- Press the key and then enter the time in HH:MM format.
- · Confirm your entry by pressing Select.
- The message "Save changes ? " is displayed.
- Confirm by pressing key.

The action is confirmed by the "OK" indication.

Note If the Auto is activated (checked), it is not possible to change the date and time displayed on the handset.

Picking up and hanging up calls automatically

Change the screen background

This menu allows you to change your handset's screen background image.

- Press Select .
- Select Settings using the ▲ or vd> keys and press Select.
- Select Display using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select Wallpaper using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select a background screen from the ones offered using the keys ▲ or .
 The image is displayed on the screen.
- Press **Select** to display the image as background. The action is confirmed by the **"OK"** indication.

The handset

Associating a new handset

You can associate other handsets with your base telephone. You then have to pair them so they are recognised.

FROM THE BASE :

To put your base in pairing mode :

- Press the button on the rear face of the base, until the light starts blinking.
- The base remains in pairing mode for one minute.

Case 1 : the handset displays "Please register".

Setting up...

Case 2:

- Select Emission free mode using the ▲ or vert keys and press Select.

- Press **On/Off** key to pair/unpair the handset with/from the line used (the paired handset is then unpaired and vice versa).

Modifying the dialing mode

You can use the dialing system based on voice frequency or pulse.

Changing the flash duration

You can configure the flash duration if you use your phone abroad or on private PABX network, you may need to modify the flash duration in order to use your telephone correctly with regard to the following functionalities: outgoing 2nd call, incoming 2nd call and 3 way conference.

Please contact your service provider to obtain the correct flash duration and then modify it by doing the following.

- Select your line using the keys ▲ or and press Select. The action is confirmed by the "OK" indication.

The list of handsets

This menu displays the list of handsets registered on the same base.

Manage handsets

Menu > Settings

- Press Select.
- Select Advanced settings using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- Select Handsets' list using the ▲ or vec keys and press Select.
- The list of handsets registered on the base is displayed on the screen.
- You can perform the following actions :

Changing the handset name : " Edit "

Change the handset name using the alphanumeric keys. Press **Clear** to delete unwanted characters. Press **Select**.

Call the handset : " Call "

Call the selected handset.

Remove the handset : " Delete "

Remove the handset's registration.

At the confirmation prompt "**Delete handset ?**" press **Yes**. The action is confirmed by the "**OK**" indication.

Intercept the call : "Interception"

Authorise a DECT earpiece, previously registered with the base, to intercept a call.

Answering machine setup

Modify the remote enquiry code

Your answering machine can be consulted remotely. With this function you can read your messages and consult your answering machine from any other telephone outside your home.

Note The default code is 0000. This code must be modified for remote access to be activated.

Answering machine delay time

With this setting you set the time in seconds before your answering machine operates.

You can increase the time before your answering machine operates to give yourself more time to come to the phone.

- Enter the desired time in seconds. Press **Select**. The action is confirmed by the **"OK"** indication.

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
