General

- Use only the AC adaptor included with this product, noted on page 2.
- Do not connect the AC adaptor to any AC outlet other than a standard 220–240 V AC outlet.
- This product is unable to make calls when:
 - The portable handset battery(ies) need recharging or have failed.
 - There is a power failure.
- The key lock feature is turned on.
- The call bar feature is turned on (only phone numbers stored in the unit as emergency numbers can be called).
- Do not open the base unit or handset other than to replace the battery(ies).
- This product should not be used near emergency/intensive care medical equipment and should not be used by people with pacemakers.
- Care should be taken that objects do not fall onto, and liquids are not spilled into, the unit. Do not subject this product to excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration or shock.
- Only the included handset can be used with the base unit. No other handsets can be registered or used.

Environment

- Do not use this product near water.
- This product should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators, cookers, etc. It should also not be placed in rooms where the temperature is less than 5 °C or greater than 40 °C.
- The AC adaptor is used as the main disconnect device. Ensure that the AC outlet is installed near the unit and is easily accessible.






Location



Setting dialling mode (tone/pulse)

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Making/Answering Calls

Making calls

- 1 Dial the phone number. \rightarrow [\frown]
- 2 When finished talking, press [***O**] or place the handset on the base unit.

Answering calls

- 1 Press (>) to answer the call.
 - You can also answer a call by pressing any dial key from [0] to [9], [*], [#], or [INT]. (Any key answer feature)
- 2 When finished talking, press [***O**] or place the handset on the base unit.

Handset locator

- 1 Press (•••) on the base unit.
- 2 To stop paging, press (•)) on the base unit or press (•) on the handset.

To adjust the receiver volume

Press () or () while on a call.

Pause button (for PBX/long distance service users)

A pause is sometimes required when making calls using a PBX or long distance service. Pressing [] 1 time creates 1 pause. Press [] repeatedly to create longer pauses.

Temporary tone dialling (for rotary or pulse service users)

You can temporarily switch the dialling mode to tone when you need to access touch tone services (e.g., telephone banking services).

1 Make a call.

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2 Press [*] when prompted to enter your

code or PIN, then press the appropriate dial keys.

• The dialling mode will return to pulse when you hang up.

Redialling/storing/editing before calling/erasing

- 1 (\odot) \rightarrow Select the item $((\checkmark))$.

Key lock

The handset can be locked so that no calls or settings can be made. Incoming calls can be answered, but all other functions are disabled while key lock is on.

To turn key lock on, press **[]/OK]** for about 2 seconds.

To turn key lock off, press **[/OK]** for about 2 seconds.

R button (to use the recall feature)

[R] is used to access optional telephone services. Contact your service provider for details.

Phonebook

Adding entries to the phonebook

The phonebook allows you to make calls without having to dial manually. You can add 20 names and phone numbers to the phonebook.

- 1 [**I**/OK] 2 times
- 2 Enter the party's phone number (24 digits max.). → [□/OK]
- 3 Enter the party's name (9 characters max.). → [≡/OK] → [☆0]

Note:

• When caller information is received and it matches a phone number stored in the unit's phonebook, the stored name will be displayed.

To edit/correct a mistake

- 1 Move the cursor to the right of where you want to correct the number/character ([◀]/[▶]).
- 2 [C] → Enter the correct number/ character.

Making calls/editing/erasing

Hot key (quick dial)

Assigning an entry in the phonebook to a hot key

Dial keys **[1]** to **[9]** can each be used as a "hot key", allowing you to dial a number from the phonebook by simply pressing a dial key.

Display indications

 When new calls have been received, the display will show the number of new calls.

• Phone numbers of the last 50 different callers will be logged in the caller list. **Example:**



*1 Shown when this call has already been viewed or answered. Press [``] to call back.

- "OUT OF AREA": When the caller dialled from an area which does not provide Caller ID service.
- "**PRIVATE**": When the caller requested not to send caller information.

DTMF mode setting

Certain service providers send caller information between the first and second rings. If the display does not show caller information after a few rings, follow these instructions to set DTMF mode.

Voice mail service

Voice mail is an automatic answering service offered by your service provider. If you subscribe to this service, your service provider's voice mail system can answer calls for you when you are unavailable to answer the phone or when your line is busy. 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Troubleshooting


If you still have difficulties after following the instructions in this section, disconnect the AC adaptor and turn off the handset, then reconnect the AC adaptor and turn on the handset.

Problem	Cause & solution
♥ is flashing.	• The handset is too far from the base unit. Move closer.
	 The AC adaptor is not connected. Check the connections.
	 You are using the handset or base unit in an area with high electrical interference. Locate the handset and base unit away from interference sources, such as antenna and mobile phones. The handset registration is cancelled. Register the handset to the base unit using the following method.
