- When replacing the batteries, use only 2 rechargeable AAA (R03) size nickel metal hydride (Ni-MH) batteries. We recommend using Panasonic rechargeable batteries (Model No. P03P).
- Replacement batteries may have a different capacity from that of the supplied batteries.

# Important information

### General

- Use only the AC adaptor supplied with this product, noted on page 4.
- Do not connect the AC adaptor to any AC outlet other than a standard 220–240 V AC outlet.
- This product is unable to make calls when:
  - the portable handset battery(ies) need recharging or have failed.
  - there is a power failure.
  - the key lock feature is turned on.
- Do not open the base unit, charger, or handset other than to replace the battery(ies).
- Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers or hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF (radio frequency) energy. (The product operates in the frequency range of 1.88 GHz to 1.90 GHz, and the power output is 250 mW (max.).) Do not use the product in health care facilities if any regulations posted in the area instruct you not to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.
- Care should be taken that objects do not fall onto, and liquids are not spilled into, the product.
   Do not subject this product to excessive smoke, dust\_mechanical vibration or shock

### Environment

- Do not use this product near water.
- This product should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators, cookers, etc. It should also not be placed in rooms where the temperature is less than 5 °C or greater than 40 °C.









## **Connections**

### Base unit (KX-TG8070/KX-TG8072)



Use only the supplied AC adaptor and telephone line cord. Insert the AC adaptor plug until a short beep sounds.

### Base unit (KX-TG8090)



Use only the supplied AC adaptor and telephone line cord. Insert the AC adaptor plug until a short beep sounds.

### Charger (KX-TG8072)

The charger can be mounted on the wall, if required.



- Never install telephone wiring during a lightning
- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)
- The AC adaptor should be connected to a vertically oriented or floor-mounted AC outlet. Do not connect the AC adaptor to a ceilingmounted AC outlet, as the weight of the adaptor may cause it to become disconnected.
- The unit will not work during a power failure. We recommend you connect a standard telephone on the same line for power protection.

### Location

- For maximum distance and noise-free operation, place your base unit:
  - away from electrical appliances such as TVs, radios, personal computers or other phones.
  - in a convenient, high and central location.


























# Battery installation and replacement

### Important:

- Use only the supplied rechargeable batteries noted on page 4, 5.
- USE ONLY rechargeable Ni-MH batteries AAA (R03) size.
- Do NOT use Alkaline/Manganese/Ni-Cd batteries.
- Ensure correct polarities (⊕, ⊝) when installing the batteries.
- Wipe the battery ends (⊕, ⊝) with a dry cloth.
- When installing the batteries, avoid touching the battery ends (⊕, ⊕) or the unit contacts.
- When replacing batteries, we recommend using the Panasonic rechargeable batteries noted on page 4, 5.
- 1 Press the notch on the handset cover firmly and slide it in the direction of the arrow.



2 Insert the batteries negative (○) end first. Close the handset cover.




## **Battery charge**


Place the handset on the base unit or charger for about 8 hours before initial use.

When charging, the battery icon is shown as follows.



When the batteries are fully charged, a remains on the display.





### Note:

- It is normal for the handset to feel warm during charging.
- If you want to use the unit immediately, charge the batteries for at least 15 minutes.
- Clean the charge contacts of the handset, base unit, and charger with a soft, dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to the exposure of grease, dust, or high humidity.

# Panasonic Ni-MH battery performance (supplied batteries)

Operation	Operating time
In continuous use	10 hours max.
In continuous standby mode	100 hours max.

### Note:

- It is normal for batteries not to reach full capacity at the initial charge. Maximum battery performance is reached after a few complete cycles of charge/discharge (use).
- Actual battery performance depends on a combination of how often the handset is in use and how often it is not in use (standby).
- Even after the handset is fully charged, the handset can be left on the base unit or charger without any ill effect on the batteries.
- The battery level may not be displayed correctly after you replace the batteries. In this case, place the handset on the base unit or charger and let it charge for at least 8 hours.

### Screen saver mode

# If the handset is not on the base unit or charger

The backlight will turn off completely after 1 minute of inactivity, even when:

- on a call
- operating the answering system

To use the handset when it is in screen saver mode, activate the handset display again by:

- pressing (▲) or (▼) when on a call or operating the answering system
- pressing (\*) for all other times

### While charging

The backlight will be dimmed after 1 minute of inactivity. The backlight can be turned off completely depending on the setting (page 16). To use the handset when it is in screen saver mode, lift the handset to activate the handset display again.

# Setting up the unit before use

### Display language

15 display languages are available.

- 5 Press (▲) or (▼) to select the desired language. → (OK) → (★)























### Note:

If you select a language you cannot read: [★]
 → [MENU] (right soft key) → [▶] 2 times →
 [OK] (right soft key) → [▼] 2 times → [OK]
 (right soft key) → [▼] 2 times → [OK] (right soft key) → [♠]/[▼]: Select the desired language. → [OK] (right soft key) → [★]

### Dialling mode (tone/pulse)

Change the dialling mode depending on your telephone line service.

"Tone": Select when you have a touch-tone service.

"Pulse": Select when you have rotary/pulse service.

- 1 [MENU] (right soft key)
- 2 Select by pressing (▲), (▼), (◄), or (►).
  → [OK]
- 3 Enter the base unit PIN (default: "0000"). → [OK]
  - If you forget your PIN, consult your nearest Panasonic service centre.
- 4 Press [▲] or [▼] to select "Call Options".
   → [OK]
- 5 Press [A] or [▼] to select "Dial Mode". → [OK]
- 6 Press [▲] or [▼] to select the desired setting.
  → [OK] → [★]

### Date and time

- 1 [MENU] (right soft key)
- 2 Select  $\mathcal{P}$  by pressing  $[\Lambda]$ , [V], [V], or [V].  $\rightarrow$  [OK]
- 3 Press (▲) or (▼) to select "Set Date & Time". → [OK]
- 4 Enter the current date, month, and year. → [OK]

Example: 17 May, 2007 [1][7] [0][5] [0][7]

- You can select the format by pressing [#]:
  - mm-dd-yy (month-date-year)
  - yy-mm-dd
  - yy-dd-mm
  - dd-mm-yy
- Enter the current hour and minute.
  Example: 3:30 PM
  [0][3][3][0] → Press [★] until
  "03:30PM" is displayed.
- 6 [OK]  $\rightarrow$  [ $^{\star}$ ]

### Note:

- To correct a digit, press [ ◄] or [►] to move the cursor to the digit, then make the correction.
- The date and time will be reset on the handset display after a power failure. In this case, set the date and time again.
- If you set the date and time with handset 1, press [ ] and [ ] on another handset to show the time on that handset (KX-TG8072).







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# Making calls

- **1** Lift the handset and dial the phone number.
  - To correct a digit, press [DEL].
- 2 [ > ]
- 3 When finished talking, press [戊] or place the handset on the base unit or charger.

### Speakerphone

- **1** During a conversation, press [♣] to turn on the speakerphone.
  - Speak alternately with the caller.
- 2 When finished talking, press [★].

### Note:

- For best performance, use the speakerphone in a quiet environment.
- To switch back to the receiver, press [ ].
- Speakerphone cannot be used when the headset is connected.

Adjusting the receiver or speaker volume Press [A] or [V] while on a call.

### Making a call using the redial list

The last 10 phone numbers dialled are stored in the redial list (each 24 digits max.).

- 1 [v/@]
- 2 [▲]/[▼]: Select the desired number.
- 3 [~]

### Editing/erasing/storing

- 1 [√/∞]
- 2 [▲]/(▼): Select the desired number. → [MENU]
- **3** Proceed with the desired operation.
  - Editing a number before calling it:

    [A]/[V]: "Edit and Call" → [OK] →

    Press [ →] or [ ▶] to move the cursor. →

    Edit the number. → [ ↑]
  - Erasing numbers: [A]/[▼]: "Erase" OF "Erase All" →

 $[OK] \rightarrow [YES] \rightarrow [\%]$ 

# ■ Storing a number into the handset phonebook:

[ $\Lambda$ ]/[V]: "Add Phonebook"  $\rightarrow$  [OK]  $\rightarrow$  Enter a name (15 characters max.; page 30).  $\rightarrow$  [OK]  $\rightarrow$  [V]

### Note:

- · When editing:
  - To erase a number, place the cursor to the right of where you want to erase the number, then press [DEL].
  - To insert a number, place the cursor where you want to insert the number, then press the appropriate dial key.

# Pause (for PBX/long distance service users)

A pause is sometimes required when making calls using a PBX or long distance service.

**Example:** If you have to dial [9] before dialling outside numbers manually, you will probably need to pause after dialling [9] until you hear a dial tone.

- 1 Press (9) to reproduce a dial tone for outside calls
- 2 Press [0] for about 2 seconds to enter a pause.
- 3 Dial the phone number.  $\rightarrow$  [ $\uparrow$ ]

### Note:

 A 3 second pause is inserted each time [0] is pressed for about 2 seconds. Repeat as needed to create longer pauses.

# Useful features during a call

### Mute

While mute is turned on, you will be able to hear the other party, but the other party will not be able to hear you.

To mute your voice, press [◄/☒].

- ullet lacktriangle is displayed.
- To return to the conversation, press 【◄/☒】 again.



















### R button

Pressing [R] allows you to use special features of your host PBX such as transferring an extension call, or accessing optional telephone services.

#### Note

• To change the recall time, see page 18.

🤼 Making/Answering Calls

### Key lock

The handset can be locked so that no calls or settings can be made. Incoming calls can be answered, but all other functions are disabled while key lock is on.

To turn key lock on, press [#] for about 2 seconds in standby mode.

- 2 is displayed.
- To turn key lock off, press [#] again for about 2 seconds in standby mode.

#### Note:

 Calls to emergency numbers cannot be made until key lock is turned off.

# Temporary tone dialling (for rotary/pulse service users)

You can temporarily switch the dialling mode to tone when you need to access touch-tone services (e.g., telephone banking services).

- 1 Make a call.
- Press [\*] when prompted to enter your code or PIN, then press the appropriate dial keys.

### Note:

• The dialling mode will return to pulse when you hang up.

# **Answering calls**

- 1 Lift the handset and press [♠] or [♣] when the unit rings.
  - Speakerphone cannot be used when the headset is connected.
- 2 When finished talking, press [\*\infty] or place the handset on the base unit or charger.

### Auto talk feature

You can answer calls simply by lifting the handset off the base unit or charger. You do not need to press [ ]. To turn this feature on, see page 16.

# Adjusting the handset ringer volume when receiving a call

Press (▲) or (▼).

### Temporary ringer off

While the handset is ringing for a call, you can turn the ringer off temporarily by pressing [\*].

### Silent mode

To switch off the ringer, press and hold [  $\bigstar$  ] when in standby mode until  $\varnothing$  shows on the display.

When an incoming call is received, only flashes on the display to indicate an incoming call. To switch on the ringer, press and hold [\*] when in standby mode until adisappears from the display.

### Note:

 Even if silent mode is set, the handset will ring for paging, and the tone sounds when receiving messages if you set the SMS alert "on" (page 22).

### **Handset locator**

Using this feature, you can locate the handset if it has been misplaced.

- 1 Press (•)) on the base unit.
- To stop paging, press (•w) on the base unit or press (★) on each handset.























# Handset phonebook

The handset phonebook allows you to make calls without having to dial manually. You can add 200 names and phone numbers.

### **Adding entries**

- 1  $(m) \rightarrow (MENU)$
- 2 [ $\blacktriangle$ ]/[ $\blacktriangledown$ ]: "New Entry"  $\longrightarrow$  [OK]
- 3 Enter the party's name (15 characters max.; page 30). → [OK]
- 4 Enter the party's phone number (24 digits max.). → [OK] → [★]

### Note

 The number of entries stored in the phonebook is displayed on the bottom of the handset display.

# Finding and calling a handset phonebook entry

### Scrolling through all entries

- 1 (m)
- 2 [▲]/[▼]: Select the desired entry.
- 3 [3]

### Searching by first character

- 1 (四)
- 2 Press the dial key ([0] to [9]) which contains the character you are searching for (page 30).
  - Press the same dial key repeatedly to display the first entry corresponding to each letter located on that dial key.
- 3 Press (▲) or (▼) to scroll through the phonebook if necessary.
- 4 [~]

### **Editing entries**

- 1 Find the desired entry (page 15). → [MENU]
- 2 [▲]/[▼]: "Edit" → [OK]
- **3** Edit the name if necessary (15 characters max.; page 30). → **[OK]**
- **4** Edit the phone number if necessary (24 digits max.).  $\rightarrow$  [OK]  $\rightarrow$  [ $\uparrow$ X]

### **Erasing entries**

- 1 Find the desired entry (page 15). → [MENU]
- 2 [A]/[V]: "Erase" OF "Erase All"  $\rightarrow$  [OK]
- 3 [YES]  $\rightarrow$  [ $^{\star}$ ]

### Chain dial

This feature allows you to dial phone numbers in the handset phonebook while you are on a call. This feature can be used, for example, to dial a calling card access number or bank account PIN that you have stored in the handset phonebook, without having to dial manually.

- 1 While on a call, press [MENU].
- 2 [ $\Delta$ ]/[V]: "Phonebook"  $\rightarrow$  [OK]
- 3 [▲]/[▼]: Select the desired entry.
- 4 Press [OK] to dial the number.

### Note:

 If you are using this phone in pulse dialling mode, you may need to press [\*] to change the dialling mode to tone before chain dialling.
 When adding entries to the handset phonebook, we recommend adding [\*] to the beginning of phone numbers you wish to chain dial (page 15).

- Select  $\mathscr{P}$  by pressing [A], [V], [V], or [V].  $\longrightarrow$  [OK]

- **4** Press ( $\blacktriangle$ ) or ( $\blacktriangledown$ ) to select the desired item in the sub-menu.  $\longrightarrow$  (OK)
- Press [▲] or [▼] to select the desired setting then press [OK].
  - This step may vary depending on the feature being programmed.
  - To exit the operation, press [\*].

  - confirm SMS is turned on
  - confirm the correct message centre numbers are stored

Consult your service provider/telephone company for details and availability.

### Note:

 A total of 20 messages can be saved in "Incoming" and "Outgoing" combined.

The answering system can answer and record calls for you when you are unavailable to answer the phone.

## Remote operation



- If you would rather use the unit's answering system than the voice mail service provided by your service provider/telephone company, ask your service provider/telephone company to deactivate your voice mail service. If your service provider/telephone company cannot do this, set this unit's "Number of Rings" setting so that this unit's answering system answers calls before your service provider/telephone company's voice mail service tries to answer your calls. It is necessary to check the number of rings required to activate the voice mail service provided by your service provider/telephone company before changing this setting.

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












# Operating additional units

### **Additional handsets**

Up to 5 handsets can be registered to a single base unit.

### Important:

- The additional handset model recommended for use with this unit is noted on page 4. If other model handset is used, certain operations (handset settings, base unit settings, etc.) may not be available.
- Additional handsets will give you the freedom to, for example, have an intercom call with another handset while a third handset is on an outside call.

### Additional base units

Handsets can be registered to up to 4 base units, allowing you to add additional base units and extend the area in which your handset(s) can be used. You need to select the desired base unit to use the handset with (page 27).

# Registering a handset to a base unit

The supplied handset and base unit are preregistered. If for some reason the handset is not registered to the base unit (for example,  $\Psi$  flashes even when the handset is near the base unit), register the handset.

- 1 Press and hold [30] on the base unit for about 5 seconds until a beep is heard.
  - If all registered handsets start ringing, press
     (\*)) to stop, then repeat this step.
  - After a beep is heard, the rest of this procedure must be completed within 1 minute
- 2 [MENU] (right soft key)  $\rightarrow \mathbb{A} \rightarrow [OK]$
- 3 [A]/[V]: "Registration"  $\rightarrow$  [OK]
- 4 [▲]/[▼]: "Register Handset" → [OK]
- 5 (▲)/(▼): Select a base unit number. → (OK)
  - This number is used by the handset as a reference only.
  - The registered base unit is indicated by "\*".

- 6 "Enter PIN" is displayed. Enter the base unit PIN (default: "0000"). → [OK]
  - If you forget your PIN, consult your nearest Panasonic service centre.
  - When the handset has been registered successfully, \( \bar{Y} \) will stop flashing. If the key tone is turned on (page 16), a confirmation tone will be heard.

### Selecting a base unit

When a specific base unit is selected, the handset will make and receive calls using that base unit only. If the handset is out of range of that base unit, no calls can be made.

- 1 [MENU] (right soft key)  $\rightarrow \mathscr{A} \rightarrow [OK]$
- 2 [ $\blacktriangle$ ]/[ $\blacktriangledown$ ]: "Select Base"  $\rightarrow$  [OK]
- 3 [▲]/[▼]: Select the desired base unit. →
  - The selected base unit is indicated by "\[ \bigs "\] located on the left of the item on the display.
  - The handset starts searching for the base unit

### Deregistering a handset

A handset can cancel its own registration (or the registration of another handset) that is stored in the base unit. This will allow the base unit to "forget" the handset.

- 1 [MENU] (right soft key)  $\rightarrow \mathscr{P} \rightarrow$  [OK]
- 2 [▲]/[▼]: "Registration" → [OK]
- 3 [▲]/[▼]: "Deregistration" → [OK]
- 4 Enter the base unit PIN (default: "0000"). → [OK]
  - If you forget your PIN, consult your nearest Panasonic service centre.
  - The numbers of all handsets registered to the base unit are displayed.
  - The handset you are using is indicated by "I" located on the left of the item on the display
- 5 [▲]/[▼]: Select the handset(s) you want to cancel. → [OK]
- 6 [YES]  $\rightarrow$  [%]

### Note

 "Register!" is shown on the handset display when you cancel registration.






















- If you want to register the handset to other base unit(s), follow "Registering a handset to a base unit", page 27.
- If the cancelled handset is registered to other base unit(s), select the base unit by following "Selecting a base unit", page 27.
- If you do not use the handset, we recommend removing the battery to prevent malfunctioning.

• To switch between handset 2 and the outside call, press [SWAP].

### Note:

 You can also press [◄/☒] to mute the conference call. Press [◄/☒] again to resume the conference call.

## Intercom between handsets

Intercom calls can be made between handsets. Example: When handset 1 calls handset 2

- Handset 1:
  - [INT]  $\rightarrow$  [A]/[ $\blacktriangledown$ ]: "Handset 2" (desired handset number).  $\rightarrow$  [OK]

# Transferring calls between handsets, conference calls

Outside calls can be transferred between 2 people. 2 people can have a conference call with an outside party.

Example: When handset 1 transfers a call to handset 2








# **Character entry**

The dial keys are used to enter characters and numbers. Each dial key has multiple characters assigned to it. You can select which character is entered by pressing a dial key repeatedly.

- Press (◄) or (►) to move the cursor.
- Press dial keys to enter characters and numbers.
- Press [DEL] to erase the character or number left of the cursor. Press and hold [DEL] to erase all characters or numbers.
- Press (\*) to switch between uppercase and lowercase.
- To enter another character located on the same dial key, press [▶] or wait 2 seconds to move the cursor to the next space, then press the appropriate dial key.
- [DEL] and [OK] are valid when the character list is shown on the bottom of the handset display.
