# Notes before use

- Charge the supplied batteries before using the camera for the first time. (DSC-S90/S80/ST80 only)
- The camera is a precision instrument. Be careful not to bump the lens or the LCD screen, and not to apply force to it. Attach the strap to prevent the camera from damage by being dropped, etc.



# Prepare the battery


For DSC-ST80, refer to the operating instructions "Cyber-shot Station".



- Connect the battery charger to an easily accessible wall outlet (wall socket) close by.
- Even if the CHARGE lamp is not lit, the battery charger is not disconnected from the AC power source (mains) as long as it is connected to the wall outlet (wall socket). If some trouble occurs while using the battery charger, immediately shut off the power by disconnecting the plug from the wall outlet (wall socket).
- When charging is finished, disconnect the power cord (mains lead) from the wall outlet (wall socket), and remove the Nickel-Metal Hydride batteries from the battery charger.

Nickel-Metal Hydride battery	Charging time
NH-AA-DA×2 (supplied with DSC-S90/S80)	Approx. 6 hours

- Time required to charge fully depleted Nickel-Metal Hydride batteries at a temperature of 25°C (77°F). Charging may take longer under certain circumstances or condition
- The CHARGE lamp may remain lit longer than six hours, but this is not a malfunction.



You can use HR 15/51:HR6 (size AA) Nickel-Metal Hydride batteries/R6 (size AA) alkaline batteries/battery pack NP-NH25/ZR6 (size AA) Oxy Nickel Primary Battery. → "User's Guide/Troubleshooting" (page 93)

#### Using the AC Adaptor

You can connect the camera using the AC-LS5K AC Adaptor (not supplied). → "User's Guide/ Troubleshooting" (page 15). Refer to the operating instructions supplied with the AC Adaptor.

## To check the remaining battery time

Press POWER to turn on and check the time on the LCD screen


- The displayed time remaining may not be correct under certain circumstances
- When using alkaline batteries/Oxy Nickel Primary Battery, the battery remaining indicator may not display
- When the AC Adaptor (not supplied) is used, the battery remaining indicator is not displayed

#### To remove the batteries

Hold the camera with the battery cover facing upward, then open the battery cover and remove the batteries. Be careful not to drop the batteries.

### To use your camera abroad — Power sources


You can use your camera, the battery charger (supplied with DSC-S90/S80), and the AC Adaptor (not supplied) in any country or region where the power supply is within 100 V to 240 V AC, 50/  $\,$ 60 Hz. Use a commercially available AC plug adaptor [a], if necessary, depending on the design of the wall outlet (wall socket) [b].



• Do not use an electronic transformer (travel converter), as this may cause a malfunction.

# Turn the camera on/set the clock





Select [Clock Set] in the 🖶 (Setup) screen and perform the procedure in step 3 above.

• Unless you set the clock, the Clock Set screen appears each time the camera is turned on.

• Do not touch the lens portion as the cover opens and the lens portion extends. Also, do not leave the camera








# Select the image size for use



## To remove a "Memory Stick"


Open the cover, then push the "Memory Stick" in once.






# Using the zoom



- You cannot change the zoom scale while shooting a movie
- When the zoom scale exceeds 3x, the camera uses [Digital Zoom].





### To cancel the Scene Selection



## To delete images

- 1 Display the image you want to delete and press  $\frac{1}{2}$  /  $\frac{1}{2}$  (delete).
- 2 Select [Delete] with ▲ then press ●.



To cancel the deletion Select [Exit], then press .

# Checking the last still image you shot (Quick Review)

Press  $\P$  ( $\P$ ) on the control button.

• The image may appear rough right after playback starts.

• To delete the image, press  $\fill \fill \fill$ 

## **Selecting** a flash mode for still images

Before step ②, press  $\blacktriangle$  ( $\diamondsuit$ ) on the control button repeatedly until the desired mode is selected.

No indicator Strobes if it is dark or against light (default setting)



- Shooting distance (when [ISO] is set to [Auto])
- W side: Approx. 0.2 to 4.5 m (7 7/8 to 178 1/2 inches)
- T side: Approx. 0.5 to 2.5 m (19 3/4 to 98 1/2 inches)
- The flash strobes twice. The first time is to adjust the light quantity

### Shooting close-up (Macro)

Before step ②, press  $\triangleright$  (③) on the control button.

To cancel, press ▶ again.

- Setting the zoom all the way to the W side is recommended.
- The in-focus range becomes narrow, and the complete subject may not entirely be in focus.
- The AF speed drops.

Shortest shooting distance from the lens surface

Setting all the way to the W side: Approx. 10 cm (4 inches)

Setting all the way to the T side: Approx.  $50\ cm\ (19\ 3/4\ inches)$ 

### **S**Using the self-timer

Before step ②, press  $\blacktriangledown$  ( $\diamondsuit$ ) on the control button.

Press the shutter button, the self-timer lamp flashes, and a beep sounds until the shutter operates (approximately 10 seconds later).



# If you shoot a still image of a subject that is difficult to focus on

- If the subject is closer than approx. 50 cm (19 3/4 inches), use the Macro mode (left column)
- When the camera cannot focus on the subject automatically, the AE/AF lock indicator changes to flashing slowly and the beep does not sound. Recompose the shot and focus again.

## Subjects difficult to focus on are:

- -Distant from the camera and dark
- -The contrast between the subject and its
- background is poor.
- -Seen through glass
- -Moving fast

## -Reflect light or have a lustrous finish



# To identify items on the screen

#### To turn off the LCD screen

Press | Clipplay/LCD on/off) repeatedly. Use the finder for saving battery power, or shooting images when it is difficult to confirm images using the LCD screen.

# To use the functions set by the control button with Scene Selection

Before shooting in step 2, select the settings with the control button. Some functions are not available, depending on the Scene Selection mode. When you press the button to select functions that cannot be combined with Scene Selection, a beep sounds. → "User's Guide/ Troubleshooting" (page 27)

# To view an enlarged image (playback zoom)

While displaying a still image, press  $\oplus$  to zoom in on the image.

To undo the zoom, press Q


### Viewing an index screen

Press  $\blacksquare$  (index), then select an image with  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown/\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$ .

## To delete images in index mode

- 1 While an index screen is displayed, press # / m (Delete) and select [Select] with ▲/▼ on the control button, then press

- 2 Select the image you want to delete with ▲/▼/◄/▶, then press to display the im (Delete) indicator on the selected image.





## To cancel a selection

Select an image you have previously selected for deletion, then press • to delete the imidicator from the image.
